



FRESHMAN RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT POLICY

Mississippi State University is committed to providing its students with a comprehensive educational experience. The University has determined that for most four-year students, living on-campus and off-campus living has numerous educational and social benefits. In recognition of the value of the living-learning experience associated with on-campus living, effective the 2008 Fall Semester, Mississippi State University will require first-year students to live on campus in residence halls. All Mississippi State University students are also required to review and adhere to the policies and regulations of Mississippi State University. All First Time Freshman students attending the Starkville campus are required to live in university residence halls. First Time Freshmen are not permitted to live in fraternity or sorority housing. For purposes of this policy, a First Time Freshman is defined as (1) a student who has never attended a college or university; or (2) a student who has previously attended any college or university for the first time in the prior summer term; or (3) a recent high school graduate who graduated in May and enrolled the following Fall term (regardless of summer enrollment); or (4) a student who successfully completed the twelve hour Summer Developmental Program regardless of the institution attended; or (5) a first-time MSU student with advanced standing (AP, CLEP or college credits earned before high school graduation). First Time Freshmen who first attend MSU in a Fall semester are required to live in a university residence hall for Fall and subsequent Spring semesters. A First Time Freshman who first attends MSU in the Spring Semester is required to live in a university residence hall during the Spring semester only. A First Time Freshman who first attends MSU during a Summer session is required to live in a university residence hall during the subsequent Fall and Spring semesters. The residence requirement is not applicable during summer sessions.

Exemptions to this requirement must be made in writing (on a Release Request Form obtained from the Department of Housing and Residence Life, or our web page at <http://www.housing.msstate.edu>), and submitted by July 15 for Fall Semester release, or November 15 for a Spring Semester release to the Department of Housing and Residence Life.

Students who fail or refuse to comply with the Residency Requirement Program or who furnish false information to a University official or office in connection with a request for exemption or all may be referred to the Dean of Students office for further action and housing charges will be placed on student's account.

Exemptions are granted to students who:

1. Are twenty-one (21) years of age or older, having reached that age no later than the first day of classes. A copy of the certificate of birth must be submitted as documentation.
2. Are married. A copy of the certificate of marriage must be submitted as documentation.
3. Have custody of dependent children. A copy of the certificate of birth must be submitted as documentation.
4. Are veterans who have completed 2 years of active military service. Documentation must be provided to verify.
5. Who lives with parent(s)/guardian(s) whose current permanent primary place of residence is not more than 30 miles from Mississippi State University – Starkville Campus.
6. Have a personal compelling circumstance. A letter concisely and fully describing the circumstance and any supporting documentation must be attached.



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PROCEDURES FOR REQUESTING EXEMPTIONS FROM THE FRESHMAN RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT POLICY

I. A written request for exemption must be submitted on a Freshman Residency Requirement Exemption Request Form and received in the Department of Housing and Residence Life on or before the following dates based upon the student's intended first term of enrollment at Mississippi State University.

- Fall Semester first enrollment – July 15
- Spring Semester first enrollment – November 15

III. The Housing Appeal Review Committee will review written requests for exemptions that are received by the applicable deadline. The Housing Appeal Review Committee will send a decision (approval or denial) on the exemption request to the student's msstate.edu email account.

IV. Students may appeal, in writing, the denial of a request for exemption to the Housing Appeal Board consisting of faculty, staff, and students.

- A. Written appeals must be submitted to the Department of Housing and Residence Life no later than ten (10) working days after notice has been sent that a request for exemption has been denied.
- B. The appeal must concisely state why the denial of the exemption request should be reversed and include any new evidence that the student contends supports the appeal.
- C. The appeals board may consult with other units of the University, including, but not limited to, the Student Health Center, the Office of Student Support Services, the Dean of Students Office, and the Office of Financial Aid.
- D. The appeals board will communicate its decision in writing to the student.
- E. The decisions of the appeals board will be final.

Once the housing contract is signed, first-year students are no longer eligible for FRE but can undergo a contract appeal process.

Requests for exemption must be received in the Department of Housing and Residence Life Administrative Services office on or before the following schedule:

- July 15 for Fall Semester
- November 15 for Spring Semester
